### Emotional Spiritual Care Training - ICISF

#### W. Derrick Lea, ADM 144

W. Derrick Lea serves as the Director for North American Division Adventist Community Services. His responsibilities focus on the Disaster Response Emotional and Spiritual Care and Young Adults Emergency Services Corps Ministries. He retired as Deputy Chief over operations after 20.5 years of service for the Prince George's County Fire/EMS Department in 2011. Using the background developed in Public Safety, he began consulting and creating development plans for organizations. This led to the largest Muslim organization in the United States, Islamic Relief USA, asking him to lead their effort in forming a Disaster Response team. After three years of successful work assisting those experiencing crisis, the organization asked that he led all their US Programs, which included Community Engagement, Grants, and Disaster Relief work.

• Sunday – Friday | Two Afternoon Sessions | Crisis intervention is a temporary but active and supportive entry into the life of individuals or groups during a period of extreme stress. Its goals are to mitigate the impact of the event, facilitate recovery processes in people who are having normal reactions to abnormal events, and restore to adaptive function. Crisis intervention in its basic life form is like psychological first aid and is not counseling or psychotherapy. This ministry equips pastors, mental health professionals, and church volunteers to assist not only in large mega disasters but also the smaller crises within their community. Why not volunteer as a police or fire service chaplain or during other local community disasters such as after a home fire? Beyond disasters, you can be deployed as an ACS Emotional and Spiritual Care volunteer. Each situation to which you are deployed provides an opportunity to provide appropriate emotional and spiritual care for traumatized survivors. The ACS Emotional and Spiritual Care credential is International Critical Incident Stress Foundation (ICISF) certified and exceeds National Volunteers Active in Disaster (VOAD) standards. Why not become empowered as an ACS Crisis Care Provider and volunteer beyond the disaster?

■ Monday | Natural Remedies for Metabolic Diseases — When the "muscle" of metabolism is inflamed, a myriad of lifestyle diseases can result — hypertension, type II diabetes, obesity, high cholesterol, and heart disease. As we explore these diseases and their simple treatments, we will use the 12 questions to discover the definition and foundation of natural remedies to address the underlying causes of disease in an other-centered way.

- Tuesday | Natural Remedies for Respiratory Illness What to do when illness strikes? Come learn how to strengthen your immune system with natural remedies to prevent and combat coughs, colds, sore throats, pneumonia, ear infections, and sinus infections. Out of the natural remedies presented, we will demonstrate a Russian Steam Bath and Steam Inhalation.
- Wednesday | <u>Natural Remedies for Aches and Pains</u> From acute pain due to a muscle injury to various causes of chronic pain such as degenerative disc disease, rheumatoid, or osteoarthritis; how do you find relief? We will learn how to sort through the myriad of "natural" treatments through the lens of the Bible and the Spirit of Prophecy. Joint fomentations, ice massage, and other modalities will be demonstrated and discussed.
- Thursday| <u>Natural Remedies for Headaches and Insomnia</u> Learn to define the common underlying causes of headaches and insomnia. Then lifestyle modification is much more obvious. You will be able to use the 12 questions to discern which home remedies are appropriate. A Hot Foot Bath will be demonstrated as an example.

### Is it Time to Fast?

Dan Augsburger lives in Berrien Springs and is married to his best friend and ministry partner RoseMarie. He received his formal education in theology at Andrews University; however, he believes a significant part of his theological education has been in sitting at the feet of Jesus pondering the Scripture and the writings of Ellen White. Monday – Friday | Learning about godly, balanced fasting is exceedingly important as we find ourselves living in the final moments of God's history. At crisis moments, personal and otherwise, God's people have often pursued fasting to obtain the desired blessings. As a result of fasting, judgments have been averted, wisdom has been gained, God's direction has been clarified, and the Holy Spirit has come in power to a newly unified and thoroughly converted group of people. Sometimes the result of fasting, however, is not so positive, such as what happened at Oxford University, when a group of young adults formed a "holiness" club that promoted fasting, abstemiousness, and extreme self-denial, which resulted in at least one member dying. Like everything else, Satan has successfully attacked fasting so that it is little practiced. In this seminar, your questions on fasting will be answered. # Lessons for Today's Christians from 1 Peter

Tom Shepherd, Ph.D. is a Senior Research Professor of New Testament at the SDA Theological Seminary, Andrews University. He is also pastor of the Eau Claire and Dowagiac Churches.
