their divine appointment to bear to the Gentiles the glad tidings of the gospel" (AA 161.1). Mrs. White also said that Paul's formal ordination marked "the beginning of a new and important epoch in his lifework. It was from this time that he afterward dated the beginning of his apostleship in the Christian church" (AA 164.2). These words can also be applied to Jay Clough, Prescott Khair, Dennis Page, and Raymond Torres. During the ordination, each man was presented for ordination by a sponsor, someone who has worked with them, mentored them, and led them in their labor. Elder Clough was called a "beam for Jesus," and his standing before the crowd is the "result of believing in the promises of Jesus." Elder Khair was told to remember that "the Maker of all things loves and wants you." Elder Page was a "brand plucked from the burning flames." When some of his leadership said, "No, Dennis," God said, "Yes, Dennis." Elder Torres was told that, when he was called, he listened and claimed the promise in Psalm 91: 1, 2: "He who dwells in the secret place of the Most High shall abide under the shadow of the Almighty. I will say of the LORD 'He is my refuge and my fortress; My God, in Him I will trust."

Though they have diligently dedicated their lives to pastoral work for the last several years, they now, with ordination, begin a more strident labor for the Lord. They were told to continue to grow, not to think they have reached a plateau. Let us pray for these men and their beautiful wives and families, that, as they perform this heart work, they may be protected, guided, inspired, reinforced, and enhanced as they carry on in this marvelous calling.



During the sacred ceremony yesterday afternoon, four devoted men were publicly ordained to bear the gospel to the world. Ordination is a confirmation that someone has been called to the ministry of the gospel. All four of these gentlemen are already working as pastors in the Michigan Conference. Their work as pastors has proven that they have been called and that it is their desire to perform a life-long work in gospel ministry. Elder Ken Denslow, Lake Union President, said that this time working as pastors is stage two of the process of ordination. This stage is "on the job training (OJT)." The first stage is the interview/selection, and then OJT where they show their evangelistic prowess as well as the check on their theology and their competency with dealing with people. After a number of years, the men are presented to the Lake Union Conference Executive Committee for review and then recommended to the global church for ordination. Once ordained, their calling is recognized around the world. Wherever they go, these men are accepted as ordained ministers in the Seventh-day Adventist Church.



Some have previous experience in fields not at all related to gospel work while others have worked for some time in positions related to the Lord's work. Some were saved from very dark paths in life while others were raised in good Christian homes and followed the Lord's way. But all four of these noble men heard the call of the Holy Spirit, and they recognized that call and answered that call and knew that their future was to work in the noblest of vocations: as fulltime ministers in the Lord's work of sharing Jesus.
